



¹First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, ²for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. ³This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. ⁵For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, ⁶who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time. ⁷For this I was appointed a preacher and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

For the sons of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light. ⁹And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings.

10"One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. ¹¹If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹²And if you have not been faithful in that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? ¹³No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be

devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money."

¹⁴The Pharisees, who were lovers of money, heard all these things, and they ridiculed him. ¹⁵And he said to them, "You are those who justify yourselves before men, but God knows your hearts. For what is exalted among men is an abomination in the sight of God."

WELCOME to all worshipers, especially visiting friends who have joined our family of faith for worship on this 15th Sunday after Pentecost. If you have come seeking blessings, you have come to the right place, for we gather around God's Word and Sacrament to receive Christ's gifts flowing from His saving cross and empty tomb! If this is your first visit, please sign the guest register in the narthex. If you have no church home, we invite you to worship with us again!

THE LORD'S SUPPER is celebrated here in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. All who commune are asked to fill out Communion Registration Cards in the pews and hand them to an usher before approaching the altar.

CONTINUOUS COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION is practiced as we transition back to normal. An Usher will direct selected worshipers pew by pew to approach the baptismal font where the pastor will administer the host (bread), and then worshipers will move to the right or the left to lift the individual cups from the trays, and, after drinking the wine, will place the cups in the baskets on their way back to their pews along the side aisle. For the time being, we will continue to offer only individual cups. Pastor Telloni or Carpenter will continue to drink from the chalice (common cup). We will restore the option of the Common Cup at the appropriate time.

SPECIAL COMMUNION NOTICE: Do you need assistance in walking to the communion rail or desire to commune at your pew? Please ask an usher who will be happy to provide assistance.

PARENTS: Please ensure that very young children write on pads of paper from the Busy Bags (*provided in the narthex*) and <u>not</u> on Communion Cards or Offering Envelopes. We also request that parents pick up scraps and remove other items on the floor or pew before leaving the sanctuary. Thank you for your cooperation!
